Help Stop the Spread of Parrot Feather

**Residents are asked to watch
for and avoid motoring or
paddling through parrot
feather and to avoid taking
boats to other lakes.**

**Why? Parrot feather is a highly invasive
aquatic weed that has clustered in Lake
Atagahi and Lake Tiaroga. The weed
reproduces from fragments that drift or
get carried to other lake areas. Currently,
Lake Ticoa and Lake Wanteska are free
from parrot feather but we need your help
to keep it out. If you do move your boat
from lake to lake, be sure your boat is
CLEAN, DRAINED, and DRY.**
